


Figure 1: https://digimapforschools.edina.ac.uk/about/

username: xxxxx password: xxxxxx

















#### Sten


From the 'Drawing tools' menu select 'Shape' and then 'Polygon'

#### Step 2

Click on each of the corners of your building until your polygon is filled.

#### Step 3

Double click to finish your drawing.



#### Hot Tip

Want to impress your teacher? Try editing your polygon using the line and fill settings.

- 1. Fill settings will allow you to change the colour of your polygon to match your key
- 2. Line settings will allow you to change the thickness and style of your line

#### Sten

From the 'Drawing tools' menu click on measure.

#### Step 2

You can choose whether you want your journey in km (metric) or miles (imperial).

#### Step 3

Click on your line on the map to get the measurement.












